#### A. PROPOSAL DESCRIPTION & IMPACT

## A-1. Description of the Initiative.

Modern Languages and Cultures, The Office of International Education, and Women and Gender Studies are requesting funds for an International Speakers Series during the 2018-2019 academic year.

We will invite a total of six international scholars whose work focuses on international issues to share their research with the Brockport community.

Speakers will address topics such as trauma and collective memory; Latinx migration and social rights; intersections of migration and rural development; gender justice movements across geographies; global feminisms; and pop culture as reassessment of histories of trauma in Asia.

A-2. Impact Statement: What change will this project deliver in the short term? What are the expected longer-term impacts?

The International Speakers Series seeks to enhance connections across cultural differences and disciplines and to engage the Brockport community in a dialogue about important global issues. It will also promote a better understanding of transnational communities where many of our international students come from, such as Latin America, Europe, and Asia.

By inviting international scholars to share their knowledge, this project will provide opportunities for a deliberative dialogue between faculty and students on a very diverse set of perspectives and cultural knowledge.

These co-curricular activities will address critical societal issues, strengthening democratic values and civic responsibility and engagement. It also will enrich the curriculum by underscoring the value of diversity and inclusion in a liberal arts education.

The project contributes to this goal by expanding co-curricular activities that will shape our students' futures as engaged citizens and alumni. By welcoming international scholars on campus, Brockport will also demonstrate its commitment to addressing issues of diversity, equity, inclusion, and globalization.

Goal 2: To be a College Engaged with its Community.

The International Speakers Series contributes directly to this goal by developing a collaborative international connection with a diverse group of scholars. Through a series of lectures on the most pressing issues facing a diverse group of nations and ethnic groups, this project will enhance the curriculum and demonstrate our commitment to global awareness. It will also help us prepare engaged citizens, strengthen democratic values and civic responsibility, and address critical societal issues.

#### C. SUSTAINABILITY

The School of Arts and Sciences, The Office of International Education, the Department of Modern Languages and Cultures, and The Women and Gender Studies Program plan to continue this initiative with the support of institutional grants.

#### D. IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

We will invite six international speakers to present on their area of international expertise during the 2018-2019 academic year; three during the fall and three during the spring semester. We will align one of the three fall speakers in September for Spanish Heritage month and a second of the three fall speakers on or near November 25, International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. We will similarly align one of the three spring speakers on or near March 8, International Women's Day.

Invited scholars also will visit classes as appropriately matched across schools and disciplines.

The funds requested will cover travel and accommodation expenses and a small speaking stipend for each scholar.
