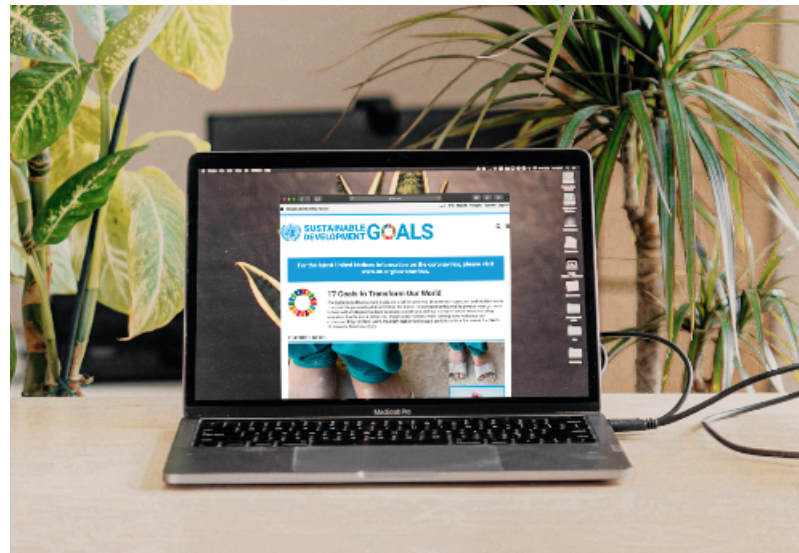

The UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) have been called the roadmap to a sustainable future by addressing complex challenges facing countries and people around the world. This course will introduce students to the history and development of the SDG #3: Good Health and Well-Being, SDG #4: Quality Education, and SDG #10: Reduced Inequality. Students will apply the insights gained to a collaborative project focused on the SDGs above with the international community-based, non-profit organization (NGO) Inkululeko in Makhanda, South Africa.

Inkululeko offers free services to students in South Africa—the country with the highest income inequality in the world. Students are led through a path of success from grades 8 to 12, either by becoming ready for college or by utilizing entrepreneurial skills.
